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Dear Pastor and SPRC Chairperson:

Greetings in the precious name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

My prayers are with you in this time of transition for your church. I am writing to share material for your use during this time and to express my expectation and that of the Cabinet that you will work diligently to enable this time of transition to be one of grace in the face of change.

Most of our churches are gathering in person with safety precautions and online. However, if pandemic mitigation regulations change, please consult with your District Superintendent regarding special arrangements that may need to be made to ensure a safe and successful transition for you and your congregation(s).

A change of pastors is part of the connectional life of The United Methodist Church. To support both the pastor and the congregation and help everyone transition more easily without impeding ministry, we have created transition workshops. You will be contacted by your District Superintendent with more details and logistics on these workshops.

We have also developed a transition calendar outlined below for the smooth transition of pastoral appointments this year. We strongly encourage you to adopt the following transition calendar:

1. June 19, 2022 will be the last Sunday the present pastor is officially in place. The order of worship that Sunday might contain the "*Order of Worship for the Farewell to a Pastor*," found on page 598 of the Book of Worship. Farewell celebrations should be held before or on that date. The pastor will not preach on June 26. Emergency pastoral needs will be taken care of by the pastor, but this is a time of moving and transition for the pastor and family. A moving date of June 20 or later should be set in consultation with others to allow for the cleaning of the parsonage and preparing for the arrival of the new pastor, which should be negotiated for a date between June 25 and July 1.

The pastor's present church is to take care of all pastoral compensation through June 30, 2022, even though the pastor's last Sunday is June 19, 2022, in the present appointment.

2. On June 26, the church will provide either a lay speaker or guest preacher for the worship service. This should be a service of reflection on the church's ministry. It can focus on gratitude for the parade of leaders over the years, a service of prayer in time of transition, or a service of

intercession for God's guidance into the future. It is simply to be a Sunday of prayer between the leaving and arriving of pastoral leadership.

3. On July 3, we recommend the service include "*The Order of Worship for the Celebration of an Appointment*," found on page 595 of the Book of Worship. The new pastor may or may not preach that Sunday, leaving the preaching to the lay speaker, if desired. This decision needs to be made in consultation with the incoming pastor. The new pastor will preside at Holy Communion, if it is a part of that Sunday's worship service.

It is our hope that these suggestions and the transition workshops will help ease some of the stress of transition for the pastors, their families, church leaders and congregations and allow everyone to move forward with more grace and understanding.
